Schools competition (ages 5 to 16)

Prizes:

Prizes in the form of black/multicultural educational resources (books, games, software packages) will be awarded in the following categories with the following monetary value:

- KS1: £150 KS3: £300
- KS2: £200 KS4: £400



This could be:

- an event (examples could include a slide presentation, a short film, poetry, a drama etc.)
- a display (such as artwork, photography or exhibition panels)
- teaching resources (maybe a booklet, puzzle or animation)
- a project or campaign (such as recorded interviews, a survey, magazine or lesson plan etc.)
- any other way of promoting the stories of Great Black Britons (perhaps a social media campaign, website design or posters)
